No Apology from Town Hall for Meeting Confusion

There was confusion about the start time of the Annual Town Council meeting on 16 May. This is the main meeting for residents to question our town representatives. Was it 6pm or 7pm? The calendar, right, on the website stated 7pm, which is what we published. It was wrong.

It transpired that there were 2 meetings that evening. The first at 6pm was the Annual Public Meeting and following that at 7pm was the normal monthly Town Council meeting (which the public can also attend).

The fact there was two meetings taking place that evening was not made clear on the website or anywhere else but Cllr Harrington or the Town Clerk, Iona Taylor, would not say sorry for the confusion. At least one lady thought it was 7pm and would have missed the main one if the WFP had not clarified it for her.

A tea-time start at six o'clock is very early, especially if you are working in Harrogate, York or Leeds. And more people may have attended if the Annual Report for 2022/23 was available to




Local Country Rock musician Luke Flear, 21, provided entertainment

MD of Connexions buses (X70, 412 & 923) Craig Temple now has a regular column in Buses magazine. The Chief Exec of main competitor Harrogate Bus Co had a regular column in the so-called Wetherby News so we offered Craig the same opportunity in our newsletter. He wrote one 'Craig's Tales' in Dec 2021.

It's a shame that Craig does not want to use our newsletter to inform readers (passengers and potential passengers) and tell us his views on the issues. Just a short summary of his 'Buses' column would be better than nothing. In a future issue we compare Connexions with Reliance, another small independent company in Yorkshire.

Reminder of the Decline in Our Bus Services in the Past Year

- ⇒ The 7 to Leeds via Boston Spa, Clifford & Bramham reduced to every hour from every 30 mins a major cut
- ⇒ The last bus from Harrogate changed from 11.30pm to 10.20pm not late enough for a proper night out
- ⇒ The X98/99 stops at all stops in Leeds meaning longer journey times the X does not mean Express any more
- ⇒ The 923 to Otley no longer has a Saturday service some European countries have MORE buses at the weekend
- ⇒ The 412 to York no longer has a Saturday service quite unbelievable!
- ⇒ Buses are still being delayed by vehicles on double yellow lines just outside the bus station councillors doing what?
- ⇒ Metro / WYCA stopped printing bus timetables for the 923 to Otley cheap effective useful marketing not used
- ⇒ Metro / WYCA stopped printing bus maps invaluable for planning journeys. But can afford £millions on themselves
- ⇒ Metro / WYCA put incorrect info on bus stops twice. Infrastructure now a mess incompetence but cllrs did nothing

It's time Wetherby Town Council had a regular agenda item at their monthly meetings to discuss these issues and keep the pressure on bus companies and Metro / WYCA to prevent even more cuts and low standards.

Town Councillors should either take action themselves or pass it on to one of our City Councillors. It is best for passengers to have one point of contact when we want to share an opinion or suggestion about the buses. Now that ClIr Lamb is on the board of WYCA / Metro we hope he can act on these issues on passengers' behalf.

We want Mayor Tracy Brabin and the bureaucratic Metro / WYCA to be accountable for their actions and we need a coherent strong voice to fight for Wetherby

bus services.

Spoons, Closures & Black Sheep

One of our readers has written to us and tried to shed some light on the latest Wetherspoons' rumours. He says that the pub chain is unlikely to pull out as one post on social media has suggested.


million and create 50 - 60 jobs. Our correspondent says that with these figures, it sounds like they may want to include accommodation, like the pubs at Ripon & Thirsk. This would not be surprising as there is a lack of rooms in the Wetherby area, especially considering it is so close to the A1(M).

The company is remaining tight-lipped about the reasons for the delay. Judging from the comments on social media, most residents are looking forward to the successful company coming here. The most likely reason for the delay is that there is more work, and therefore expense, than at first thought. This matter must clearly be resolved and planning permission granted before any progress can be made.

Whatever the situation, our reader concludes 'the sooner we get cheap beer and food the better.' Cheers to that.

Meanwhile it was announced recently that 8 pubs/restaurants are closing every day, caused by a combination of factors. This is a depressing figure as rarely do buildings return to being pubs once they have been sold.

Soonafter came the news that Black Sheep Brewery was going into administration




after failing to find an investor. This shocked many as it is a high profile popular company with a good reputation and a highly-regarded brewery tour at their Masham HQ. But they have not closed yet and recently tweeted:

"We've just had 22 tonnes of malt delivered and are busily making more

beer and can supply everyone as normal. So, if you'd like to help us, get out to your local and sup some Black Sheep!".

As the saying goes - use it or lose it. YOUR CHOICE. Pete.

Thanks for writing, Pete. Yes, there are very few coaches visiting now as there is no designated coach park and they go to the Services instead. All our cafes, bakers, takeaways, restaurants, pubs, newsagents, supermarkets and many other businesses have lost out because of it. Few will be attracted by the Town Council website. What is being done to attract more visitors off the A1(M)?

We agree too that you must use it or lose it, whatever 'it' is.
Raising serious issues and getting your message across effectively is becoming more difficult. You soon get drowned out on social media. And chances are those who you want to hear your complaint will not see it. It's harder to not see or ignore a newsletter (though some try).

A free, independent community newsletter is vital now more than ever. You may need your story to be heard one day.



It is not hard to see results of criminal acts in front of our eyes on the streets of Wetherby and on social media. And to see that there is a great deal of concern about the Police's ability to deal with it.

Two retailers in the town centre have been broken into in recent weeks - Superdrug in the Horsefair Centre and Boot & Shoe on the Shambles, see images below.

John Wilson, owner of the shoe shop, said the crime was committed at 1.00 (Fri 12 May) in the morning. He says they "took most of our summer stock of Skechers, Puma, Nike and Doc Martens. The police have CCTV of the men coming in and out of the shop but they said there is not much chance of catching anyone. The building was insured but unfortunately we had let the contents insurance lapse. We have done a stock take and we have lost £3-4000 worth of stock."

"Easy for Thieves to Do What they Want"

John is closing the shop with a heavy heart as it is not worth restocking and spending more money on extra security. He complains that "there is no external help out there anymore. Nobody polices the area, making it so easy for the thieves to do what they

He ends by saying they have 'met lots of nice customers' and 'made loads of new friends'. The shop is currently having a Closing Down Sale.



Many comments on social media were sympathetic to business **owners.** One asked "Are the lack of officers making Wetherby a vulnerable, easy to target community given its demographic and ease of access?". She adds "It is guite shameful that the Police Station is not used to its full potential."

Another recalled: "I worked at Wetherby Police Station in the early 1980's, we used to have 4

patrol officers & a Sergeant per shift. In 1984, there was a huge public order incident involving a stag party from Huddersfield, who had been causing mayhem in The Brunswick. I had my jaw & cheekbone fractured & other officers were assaulted. Assistance was there within minutes, the locals were helping out too! There were 23 arrested.

I don't think there would be that kind of timely response these days. Sadly, policing isn't what it used to be."

We looked for any recent comment by Wetherby Business Association or a Town Councillor on the issue of crime affecting local businesses. We could not find any.



A Wetherby parent has criticised the 'lack of effort' by West Yorkshire police after their son's moped was stolen. The thieves smashed the vehicle beyond repair.

The parent complained that "We have not received one phone call or visit after providing them the information. They haven't arrested the youths involved. We have phoned 3 times for updates and still heard nothing."

Wetherby Business Association - Changed its Mind Twice

Wetherby Business Association (WBA) made it clear in Feb 22 that they 'will not be making any comments or using your free press in any way now or in the future'. They wanted nothing to do with the only serious printed news source for the town. They also tried to silence us by saying 'can I ask you to ensure we are not mentioned in any future publications'.



No Support from WBA for A1(M) Sign

Jamie Hullah, Chair of the Association, provided no reasons for their noncooperation or why a body that is supposed to represent Wetherby businesses does not want any publicity. Strange behaviour in our view. Especially when we have made many reasonable suggestions to improve our

town and attract more visitors to its businesses, including a sign on the A1(M) and making empty shops look attractive. We have a clear desire to support local businesses. We even offered 'pay what you can for advertising' for local businesses when we began and have advertised them for free in special features.

Following Mr Hullah's email in Feb '22 we featured many articles that you would expect a business association to comment on but they remained silent. Nothing on social media either - taking no part in discussions on Wetherby Grumbler or Nextdoor about issues that affect their members.

WBA are a limited company and it is, of course, entirely up to them who they deal with and who they ignore. They have refused to meet with the Town Council as well, though the exact reasons for that were not made clear.

Earlier this year, we asked the WBA for a comment on having a Big Dip event in the Wharfe at New Year, like Otley's. To our surprise, Mr Hullah replied and indeed wanted to meet with the Editor. A welcome change of tune from the WBA, we thought. But we stated that 'there is clearly a large gap in trust that must be bridged.'

The Editor suggested Morrisons café but Mr Hullah preferred a rather more upmarket café. The Editor agreed, arrived on time at 9am, ordered his expensive coffee and waited. When meeting a professional you expect to be contacted if they are going to be late. Time is money and the Editor does not appreciate his time being wasted. 20 mins later, coffee was drunk and the Editor left.

Later Mr Hullah was very apologetic and said that he 'was unfortunately held up on another matter and couldn't find a number to call you on.' So we arranged another date late February. The day before that meeting Mr Hullah wrote to say sorry but he had been called to a meeting in a northern city. 'I will come back to you as soon as I can with some alternative dates.' he said. Nearly 3 months later we are still waiting.

Jamie Hullah, Director & Chair of WBA since July 2021 is a director of a local telecoms company which has had contracts for Wetherby Town Council

The other directors are Stephen Kay and Angus Taylor. Darren Northfield is secretary

There are no images of the Chair or directors on their website

WBA supports events at Christmas and Bonfire night

When asked why the 'Wetherby Means Business' Facebook Group with 1000s of members suddenly disappeared, WBA made no comment

The WBA website shows no news or events in Jan - May so far this year

It has 103 members, according to their website, and hence a minimum income of £5000 per year. It does not provide figures for year on year so we do not know if membership / income is increasing / decreasing or staying the same

WBA does not have a newsletter, or an annual review showing what it's spent and achieved in the previous year

The latest accounts at Companies House shows that in Oct 2021 the company has about £30K in the bank

As a business owner himself, the Editor has considered joining this association but he is not convinced that it would benefit him, support him or represent his interests, judging by the website and behaviour described above.

Alec Shelbrooke has been our Conservative MP for 13 years since May 2010.

In the last election in 2019 he won 58% of our vote beating Labour by over 17,000 votes. He was a Remainer. From Dec '19 to May '22 he has voted 467 times out of 560 (83%) and has rebelled once against the party whip (Mar '22). He refused to inform his constituents whether or not he supported Boris Johnson in the No-Confidence Vote. He was a strong supporter of Liz Truss in the Leadership Battle. She promoted him to an MoD Ministerial post in Sep '22, which he then quit / was sacked within 2 months.

We are grateful to the Town Clerk for responding to our request for information. It was 'handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000', as usual.

1 Why you did not respond to my last email of 22 April? TC does 'not hold information in relation to this item' Absurd response! 2 Cllr Lamb - plse provide examples of any 'unwarranted abuse and vitriol'. Cllr Lamb did not provide any, offered to meet me instead.

3 Why it is not clear from the website that there is a full Council meeting, as well as the Annual one on Tuesday. 'The information for Tuesday's annual meeting of Wetherby Town Council is displayed on our website on the following page: https://www.wetherby.co.uk/

Town_Council_Meetings_26482.aspx This is the same page that is always used for meetings of Wetherby Town Council. You were also sent the

agenda for the annual meeting of the Town Council in an email at 5.53pm on 10/5/23. The annual town meeting is not a meeting of the Town Council. Information relating to that meeting is on the separate, dedicated page on our website: https://www.wetherby.co.uk/

Annual_Town_Meeting_26485.aspx' We think they are saying it was clear. It wasn't. They ignored their mistake on the website - see front page. Perhaps call the 2 meetings different names next year? And consult on the time of 6pm for the Annual Public mtg?

4 Cllr Harrington - Who will you be meeting regularly at Transdev now Alex Hornby has left? Apparently Cllr Harrington meets bus company bosses in her role as LEEDS CITY Councillor, not WETHERBY TOWN Councillor. We write to both her councillor email addresses to cover both eventualities. She has not responded.

5 Your opinion on the 6-month review of Transdev X98/9 bus service & Metro infrastructure compared to Derbyshire & Poznan. This was addressed to all councillors - none responded.

6 Cllr Mulhall, plse answer the 3 simple questions on page 5 about the Coronation event. Cllr Mulhall did not respond. The Town Clerk did:



Q6 - Council's photo at peak-viewing time. 200 max. Wetherby has a population of 17,000+

A) How many people attended? 'The event's management plan estimated that 1250 to 2500 people would attend throughout the day.' Not even a rough estimate could be provided. The figure there is how many they expected to attend - it is optimistic in the extreme and based on what? They sent us the photo above showing 200 max. B) How much did it cost? Not even a rough estimate could be provided. C) What consultation took place with residents? No response.

7 Cllrs on the Market Ctte - Your reaction plse to the views of ex market trader Zoe Cunningham on page 7. No response.

These are not difficult questions. The responses are incomplete and unsatisfactory.

Let's hope our new councillors will take an interest in some of these areas and can find the answers



Volunteer organisations in Wetherby, including Wetherby Civic

Society, Wetherby Historical Trust, U3A Local History Group, Wetherby in Bloom, have come together with Wetherby Town Council to plan the commemoration of the bicentenary of the auction sale of Wetherby by the 6th Duke of Devonshire in October, 1824.

The sale converted the town from being the property of one man into a town owned by its inhabitants and was a unique event in English history.

The date next year selected for the celebration is Saturday, 12 October 2024, which was the second day of the four day auction. Current plans for the

commemoration, so far, hopefully will include the present Duke unveiling a plaque on the Town Hall, reprinting of the original sale catalogue, an exhibition of the shops which have been in the centre of town in the past and talks on the Great Sale itself.

The commemoration has been designated "WETHERBY 200" and the logo of which you will be seeing more of in coming months is shown above.

New Lidl Store, Care Home & Eco-Homes for the over 55s

Lidl has written to interested residents with an update on their plans for a new Lidl store, 84-bed care home and eight eco-homes for the over 55s on the Mercure Wetherby Hotel site.

They thank people for their support of the plan which they say "will regenerate this important gateway site into Wetherby, whilst bringing more choice for shoppers and a much-needed care facility." They say the "project has been sensitively designed to complement the surroundings and will be BREEAM rated Excellent". They emphasize that the store will not be visible from the roundabout.

Lidl ask that supporters make their views known as soon as possible to Leeds City Council's planning department. They claim that "every letter of support will make a huge difference to the outcome of the application, so please

email <u>planning@leeds.gov.uk</u> with the reasons why you support the plans before time runs out." Remember to quote the application reference number (23/01507/FU).

United needed a result at West Ham and the faithful were given hope with a great volley from Rodrigo to give the Whites the lead. At half time it was 1-1 and all to play for.




