#### 'Totally Irresponsible' Article **Claims Cllr Lamb**



In the last issue we highlighted the continuing problem of vehicles blocking buses leaving the bus station. It has been happening for over a year and nothing has been done about it. Cllr Lamb, Leader of the Conservative Group and Board Member of Metro/WYCA was upset with the article and wrote:

"Your reporting on the bus station

is totally irresponsible. Second hand reports to the police via myself or anyone else are meaningless. The reason nothing has happened is because no one is reporting instances to the police. If I witness it with my own eyes, I can and will report it. I will challenge people as I did with a motorist parked on white zig zags last week. Your reporting is making it harder to get anything done. I hope you'll correct this next time." We refute this on Page 5.






## No Wetherspoons for Wetherby **Drinkers are Desperately Disappointed**

'Spoons statement is brief. They say: "Whilst we have only owned the property for a relatively short period of time, the landscape of the hospitality industry has changed significantly. After careful consideration we wanted to let you know that for commercial

reasons which we do not intend to be drawn upon, we have chosen to sell the Saint Angelo property.





This story has raised more interest than any other (including council tax increases and low standards of our public bodies). It attracted well over 300 comments on one social media platform. (Unhelpfully, there were 2 posts on the same topic). The vast majority were in favour of the pub chain coming to Wetherby.

Cllr Lamb said he is 'very disappointed' as it would have been a 'welcome addition' to the town.

In Issue 30 we told you how the national press (The Sun & Metro) portrayed us as fingerpointers who were too posh for a 'Spoons.



We agree with Cllr Lamb. It is



a great shame to lose the £2.25M investment and 50 - 60 proper jobs. One 'Grumbler' on social media says it's another nail in the coffin of the town. It is true that many businesses are selling up or moving due to high energy and rental costs or staff shortages. A few are starting up too, see Man Cave on page 3.

To get the cheapest drinks residents must continue to travel to nearby towns (like we do for petrol). York, Harrogate, Leeds, Otley & Knaresborough all have these great pubs, even Garforth has one. This is a massive setback to the town. A Wetherspoons would attract visitors who would spend money in other shops and restaurants, especially motorists on the A1(M). JD Wetherspoon is a quality company with higher standards than most.

All 15 Councillors Attended, plus 2 members of the public. £250 was awarded to the 2023 Wetherby Arts Festival event.

Better Wetherby Partnership Ltd newsletter was acknowledged. Wetherby Free Press, a newsletter for the whole community was not. They removed 'List of Correspondence' earlier this year. Wonder why!

Cllr Harpham has replaced Cllr Frame on the Welcome to Wetherby committee.

Cllrs will hold surgeries EVERY THURSDAY between 11 & 1 at the Town Hall. If you go, plse tell us your experience.

All issues at Aldi roundabout have been resolved. *Have they?* June's crime figures showed 'slight increase' - 11 anti-social behaviour and 95 general. *Increase compared to what? The month before or last June? More info plse.* 

The only correspondence mentioned was about a railway station for Wetherby. Never going to happen, waste of effort. They ignore our reasonable and legitimate questions in our correspondence to them. Shameful behaviour.

£16,000 a month spent on Town Hall staff costs.

No actions stated in June's Climate Emergency Ctte meeting for any of its 3 members.

The Wetherby News at £2 has all but given up on the town. Until there's an alternative, please help us help your community.



#### A 'What's On' not approved on Facebook Group Wetherby Grumbler!

27,500 members of the group were denied access to a simple image, right, showing a few community events on that weekend. What possible reason could there be for that?

We asked Admin Vicky and she replied that business advertising is on Tuesday's only. So a What's On is seen purely as a business ad and nothing else. The many not-for-profit community organisations suffer because of this ridiculously harsh interpretation of the rules. This Facebook group is the largest by far in Wetherby and should encourage community spirit.

The organisations that lost out are: Wetherby Food Festival, Wetherby Bandstand and their sponsors, a local craft fair organiser, Wetherby Musical Theatre, Wetherby car boot sale, and a Cancer charity that benefits from duck food sales.

As we reported in the last issue, Admin have censored WFP previously because they had a few complaints (no figure given) from anonymous critics who hate free speech. We still have no clue of the details of these complaints. No redress, no appeal. It's simply an unfair process with autocratic and inconsistent decision-making.

A useful What's On guide like this benefits everyone. Only in Wetherby would it be censored.



# Easy to Access Information with DalesBus & Transdev

Short-sighted bus companies and transport authorities like Metro/WYCA see little value in printed timetables/maps and have used new technology as an excuse to stop printing them. Senior bureaucrats and marketing people do not use buses so do not realise how invaluable they are to the 1000s who do not use smartphones, PCs etc. It is far easier to look at a network map (A4 size and bigger) on paper than a tiny smartphone screen, especially when you are out and about.

Companies like Transdev (X98/99, 7 and 8 routes) know this and invest in high quality literature - see right. They sensibly use it as a highly visible marketing tool.

#### Reminder of Important Bus Facts (to inform our councillors)

- ♦ Transdev's route 7 to Leeds via B Spa was reduced to hourly from half-hourly in Nov '22
- ♦ The late night route 7 service from Harrogate at 11.30pm was cut in Nov '22. The last bus is now 10.20pm
- ♦ There is NO Saturday service to York (Connexion's route 412) or Otley (Connexions route 923)
- ♦ There are no evening services to York
- ♦ There is not a single bus shelter on the Aire Road/Ainsty Road estate
- Wetherby has old and new bus stop flags, and dirty cases with minimal information.
- ♦ WYCA/Metro have stopped printing their 7 invaluable network maps, see right

## 'Totally Irresponsible' Article cont'd

Shooting the messenger is something we are used to. But to say our reporting of a problem makes it harder to 'get anything done' takes it to a new level.

This is what we said in the last issue to provoke such a reaction:

"We also asked him (ClIr Lamb) if he was seriously suggesting that passengers should call the Police on 101? Would the Police really want their phone lines clogged up with this? Why don't the bus drivers or companies report it on our behalf? ClIr Harrington could raise it with the Police & Transdev in her meetings with both organisations."

We still think it is totally unreasonable and unrealistic to expect the public/ passengers to call the Police when this happens. The offending vehicle could be moved after a few seconds or 10 minutes, nobody knows. Most, if not all, passengers would expect the bus driver to report this to his bosses / the Police.

It is still not clear who is ultimately responsible for resolving this situation but from Cllr Lamb's writings it looks like the Police. He says there is no point in telling your councillor about this problem, as it is 'meaningless'. (So does want to know about other constituent problems that he is not directly responsible for? It is unclear.) Cllr Lamb does not quote anything we said as being untrue, so what exactly he wants us to 'correct' is a mystery.

Cllr Lamb explains why on social media, adding he was 'happy to answer any questions'. (Turns out he wasn't)

The main points of Cllr Lamb's post was:

- "Norma and I have stepped down as Directors for 2 reasons.
- 1. A change in the members code of conduct.
- 2. Better Wetherby is now a mature and well established organisation with a strong and growing membership. They have some great people who can deal with all the responsibilities that come with being directors which frees both of us up to focus on other things.

We'll still be supporting the work of the group.

We helped to set the group up as a large number of organisations in the town we're working

independently on very similar issues so we encouraged them to work more formally together

The groups include; Wetherby Town Council, Wetherby Civic Society, Churches Together Wetherby and Kirk Deighton Countryside Partnership. Schools and medical practices.

I applaud anyone and everyone who gives up their time to try and make the place they live in better for everyone. You Amy or may not agree with any or all of the work but at least they're trying.

We're lucky in Wetherby that the quiet majority of people roll up their sleeves and get stuck in to try and improve things and provide some wonderful things for the town. There'll always be detractors but thankfully they're a minority. For them, we have Wetherby Grumbler.

Hope that helps but happy to answer any questions."

Taking him at his word, we asked these simple, reasonable questions:

- 1 Why is 'Better Wetherby' a Limited Company? No Answer & No Explanation on Website
- 2 Why is this fact not highlighted prominently on BWPL's website, press releases and literature? No Answer
- 3 Isn't it true that BWPL represent nobody but their Directors, members and the leaders of those organisations you mention? No

4 How many individuals with no group alliances are members of this Partnership? (Plse do not include those who receive the newsletter, like me in those figures.) No Answer or Info on Website. 700 receive their newsletter, like me, but are NOT necessarily supporters

5 Which are the schools and medical practices you mention exactly and why have you not stated them? **No Answer or Info on**Website. In fact there are **NO** 'medical practices' mentioned at all on their website.


6 You imply that anyone who disagrees with you are detractors and just moaners who do nothing and are 'thankfully a minority'. 'For them, we have Wetherby Grumbler', you say. I get a lot of stick on here and am not an elected representative. Should you not have a thicker skin? **No Answer** 

7 BWPL is a mainly Conservative organisation, isn't it? If not, which Conservative councillors disagree with its aims and want no association with it? **No Answer, despite claiming to be non-political** 

8 BWPL is an unelected limited company that purports to represent Wetherby, isn't it? Why does Wetherby Town Council not do that? Have they privatised this function to BWPL? **No Answer** 

9 Is any public ie taxpayers money given to this Limited Company via the Town Council or anywhere else? **No Answer or Info on**Website

10 Lidl say that 2500 residents support the Lidl store. How many supporters against this plan does BWPL claim to have? **No Answer** or Info on Website



Cllr Lamb started his post with 'I'm sorry to disappoint but there's not much to see here!' Whenever we hear that, it arouses our suspicions.

Even more so, when he refuses to answer questions, after he says he is 'happy to answer any questions'. Extraordinary!

He & BWPL simply told us to look at their website and Feb's newsletter where we will find 'most' of the answers. Very unhelpful, showing they do not want to be accountable and open in that public forum.

And the statement was simply untrue - 'most' of the answers could not be found, as the bold text above shows.

Cllr Lamb takes a swipe at his 'detractors'. Like him, we

have 'a minority' of detractors but we don't complain about them. We ignore the illogical / stupid / insulting and address the points of the other detractors, usually showing them to be biased or foolish, or both. We should appreciate the fact we have Freedom of Expression.

This article is yet another example of why we need a proper local paper with serious journalists who ask questions. There is no publication but WFP to make our town's organisations accountable.



# Local Democracy Page - Our MP Alec Shelbrooke

Alec Shelbrooke has been our Conservative MP for 13 years since May 2010.

In 2019 he won 58% of our vote beating Labour by over 17,000 votes. He was a Remainer.

**UPDATE** - From Dec '19 to 21 June 2023 he has voted 640 times out of 817 (78%)

In that time he has rebelled twice against the party whip. Source - www.publicwhip.org.uk/

He refused to inform his constituents whether or not he supported Boris Johnson in the party's No-Confidence Vote. Alec was a strong supporter of Liz Truss in the Leadership Battle.

As PM Liz Truss promoted him to an MoD Ministerial post in Sep '22, which he then quit / was sacked after 49 days, the same length of time his boss lasted in post.

For those who missed it, here's what Alex told the Wetherby Grumbler Facebook Group.

"I'm husband to Jane, a lawyer for an electric vehicle charging company and chair of the Labour's Wetherby & Harewood branch (Harewood Wetherby BLP). I've joined the Council to represent all residents and workers in Wetherby, to help protect vulnerable people in our community and to improve that community for everyone.

I'm an average amateur footballer and former below-average amateur cricketer. At weekends you'll find me gardening, in a pub beer garden or walking with Jane & our Labrador Nahla in the Yorkshire countryside!

Please reach out if you need any help or have any issues that you'd like the Town Council to consider. Although we may not be able to solve them directly, I'll always try to point you to someone who can."



We thanked Alex and wished him well. We also asked him to "read past issues of the Wetherby Free Press for the many serious issues that our (Conservative) councillors have ignored, let alone done anything about. We don't expect you or the other new councillors, Kazia Knight, Jane Lovocah & Barbara Harpham to turn this massive oil tanker around immediately but updates in the week before publication would be

appreciated."

## A Lesson in Life

In Oct 2022, the Wetherby Free Press designed and inserted 4 ads (pictured) on the front page of our newsletter for Kirk Deighton businessman, David Birks of Eternal Peace Funeral Plans. Nearly 2000 of our newsletters with these 1/4 page

ads were printed. 3000 readers saw them online. The advert is for his wife's business which is an ongoing concern.

Payment for this ad was promised but not received

We requested payment of the £220 invoice on 29 Nov 2022. No response so we sent 2 reminders. In Jan 23 Mr Birks said 'I will sort it on my return'. Ten days later we asked for a date to expect payment. He says he gets back on 28th Jan and apologises for the delay and thanks us for our patience. No date is given. On 1 Feb we ask for a date again. He replies 'within 2 weeks'.

Payment was not made within 2 weeks and no contact made from him. Eight days after the last payment date, we express our disappointment in his behaviour and hope he 'will pay the money eventually and if not, then

that will be on your conscience'.

He responds without any clear information about why he is unable to pay and ends with the (poorly typed) sentence "I shkukd be able to make payment within 40 days when they release ny funds."

No date is given and we let 4 months pass before contacting him again in June 23. We simply ask 'any news?' He does not respond.

A month later at the end of July we see a car in Wetherby promoting his wife's business in the advert. We write again to him and his wife and suggest that they make a repayment plan, at the very least, for the ads that promoted his wife's business.

to Dakota Legal Services Ltd

They ignore the compromise and give us no hope of payment. Catherine Thomas said 'it's nothing to do with me' as she did not take any contract out with me. That is true, there was no contract with her. He said his company (Eternal Peace Funeral Plans) is 'dormant' and that it 'doesn't exist'. Companies House records say that the company changed its name to Dakota Legal Services Ltd in April 2023. He did not inform us of this name change. In a final message on 31 July he asked how much he owed and said that he will pay us by Friday. We sent our bank details to him again but again no payment.



In all aspects of life, people should treat others how they would like to be treated themselves. Had he been open and honest with us about his financial difficulties from the start and explained them, we would have sympathised, accepted the situation and moved on.

Instead, with the false hope we were given, we wasted time on continuing to communicate with him. We were patient and polite throughout, making clear our wishes and the consequences of non-payment towards the end. He did not inform us that he changed his company's name but said that the old company is 'dormant', which therefore cannot be true. His wife is correct legally that there was no contract with her but to say it is 'nothing to do with me' is stretching it, when



all 4 front page adverts promoted her current business and she is married to him. The attitude and false promises from him were disappointing and frustrating. He neither suggested or agreed to a payment plan. £5 a month would have been / be acceptable. It is a shame because the money could have printed 100s of Wetherby Free Press issues for many months to come. So it is our readers who suffer in the end.

Perhaps the lesson we have learnt is to be less trusting and patient, and not waste our time on giving uncommunicative late payers chance after chance. We hope other local businesses will learn from our experience.

If you have a similar story, we'll publish it. It must be true, honest opinion or in the public interest.

# No Constitution for Wetherby & Villages Clean River Group (& still no apology)



In the last issue we reported that when Linda Richards was a Leeds City Councillor she set up Wetherby and Villages Clean River Group (WAVCRG) and used the Group's Twitter account to promote the Conservative Party in 2 tweets. Neither of these tweets had anything to do with the pollution of our river with raw sewage.

Not a single member of the Group or Conservative colleague of Mrs Richards noticed these political Tweets at the time in 2022.

We asked for a public apology from Mrs Richards. She has yet to express any regret.

Nor has group member Boston Spa Parish Council whose Chairman, Keith Blake, said incorrectly that the Group 'has issued an apology'. No apology for that either.

The other group member Thorp Arch Parish Council responded to an email. Nicola Midgley, Chair, said that they are non-political and that Boston Spa Parish Council spoke on their behalf.

We responded that if they were truly non-political they would apologise to us and not condone this poor behaviour by their silence. No response.

An assurance this would not happen again would be nice but was not provided by anyone in the Group. In other words no action has been taken by the Group apart from taking the offending tweets down nearly a year after they were posted.



We wrote to a professional Clean Rivers Group in Ilkley who have gained much well-deserved national publicity for their hard work in exposing the scandal of filthy discharges into the Wharfe.

Prof Becky Malby of Ilkley Clean Rivers Group told us that Wetherby has applied for bathing status at 3 sites in Wetherby and all were rejected. She pointed out that Ilkley have a constitution. There is no constitution for Wetherby's group as a quick look on their website showed. Ilkley have a professional, informative and user-friendly website. Compared to Ilkley's, the Wetherby one is basic and amateurish, see below.

We asked former Cllr Richards to send us their constitution if they have one and about the failed bathing status applications. No response.

At the end of the day, it's ACTION that matters. If WAVCRG want to tell us real progress they've made on reducing sewage discharges, we'll gladly publish it.

# Window Blessed at St John's Catholic Specialist School

A Commemorative stained glass window marking 150 years of education at a West Yorkshire specialist school was blessed during a recent ceremony.

The window, at St John's Catholic Specialist School in Boston Spa was blessed by Father Sean Molloy at a special event which saw current and past pupils join with staff from the school, families and loved ones to gather for a grand unveiling and blessing.

St John's (formerly St John's Catholic School for the Deaf) supports children and young people who are hearing impaired, on the autistic spectrum or have complex sensory or communication challenges.

The school had been due to celebrate its 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2020. However, as a result of Covid many of its plans, including the creation of the window, had to be postponed.

The window was created by Yorkshire glass artist Zoe Eady who worked in close collaboration with the school's pupils and

staff, including Art Teacher, Emma Fowler, for over a year to ensure their ideas were included in its final design. As well as in-school workshops, children from St John's visited Zoe's studio, the Glass Garden in Leeds, for sessions there.

Head Teacher at St John's, Ann Bradbury, said: "The window is a true reflection of St John's and represents how we have evolved over the last 150+ years as a school and what we are; a place where every voice is heard and every voice is celebrated. That is absolutely represented in the stunning final window. The children expressed their views about what is important to them about St John's, and Zoe has taken that input to create a window which perfectly represents those thoughts. The window is an important part of St John's history."

She concluded "It has been a fantastic experience and we're incredibly proud of our window."


