

Leisure Centre Update

Leeds City Council say "Works on the pool hall ceiling are going well and the new lighting and decoration should be finished by the end of this week. Once the ceiling works have been complete the top level of scaffolding will be removed and works will begin on decorating and improving the lighting at poolside. This should be completed about 5 July, then we will begin deep cleaning the pool ready to begin refilling. We're still on track for a Mid-July opening.

Decoration works are nearly complete in the gym and we're really happy with the new look so far. The space looks a lot brighter and welcoming. At the start of July new flooring will be laid in the old sauna and our new branding will be installed. We will also be

We have noticed that our Conservative Councillors retweet Tweets from WISE but **not** those


from the Foodbank.

A Great Walk by Bus - Knaresborough by the Nidd

Why not leave the car at home and let the bus take the strain on these (hopefully continuing) hot sunny days? Take advantage of cheap fares on the quality operator in our town - Harrogate Bus Company.

Here's a suggested itinerary for a great morning or day out. Take bus number 8 to Harrogate from the bus station at 9.55 or a few minutes later on the First Avenue, Sandbeck & Ainsty Road/Aire Road estates.

Get off at the stop after St James Retail Park just before the bridge over the Nidd. Stay on this side of the river and take the track to the left. You will soon come across the fantastic Watermill café with Rachel and her friendly staff. It's coffee time and a piece of cake if you fancy it (they're highly recommended)! Sit by the river and enjoy watching the ducks and perhaps some swimmers. There's duck food at the café for only £1.

Continue by the river but take the track slightly to the left. The path follows the Nidd and you're soon back close to the river again, passing

through woodland. After 1.5 miles of very pleasant walking (about 40 mins), you reach Mother Shipton's Inn. Cross the bridge to take the road on the left which soon takes you to the boats, cafes and the impressive Knaresborough railway bridge.

There's plenty to see and do in Knaresborough. Market day is Wednesday and don't forget Wetherspoons for a cheap drink. You're on the bus so no worries about drink-driving.

Bus number 8 back leaves Knaresborough bus station at 11.21, 1.21pm & 4.21pm. Hope you have a Grand Day Out!

In May, local guide dog owner Hayley set herself a target of cycling 10 miles a day in her garden, on a static bike, to raise life changing funds for Guide Dogs.


Wildlife of Wetherby

Prison Officer's Conduct "Shameless" after Inappropriate Relationship

A prison officer, who also worked as an escort, has admitted misconduct in a public office following events at *HMP Wealstun*, Thorp Arch, a low level category prison for men at Thorp Arch. Emma Crossley, 30, was given an 8-month jail sentence, suspended for 18 months. She was also given a six-month curfew order, 200 hours of unpaid work, and 20 rehabilitation days.

Leeds Crown Court heard that she was seen on CCTV looking hot and bothered after leaving the cell of an inmate. The prosecution said: "The inference was that they had been intimate in the cell."

Evidence of a relationship was found by monitoring the jail's phone when the pair talked about their future plans. On arrest,
police found more evidence to connect them, including a
Valentine's card from the prisoner. Crossley refused to admit to
the relationship in interview, despite buying a phone to speak to him.



2003 Demo at Wealstun made National Headlines

At the trial the defence said "Her life had been completely falling apart, she had split from her partner of six years. Her emotions were manipulated (by the inmate) and it was the trigger for the relationship." Judge Andrew Stubbs also heard that it was now the biggest regret of her life.

Alec Shelbrooke has been our Conservative MP for 13 years since May 2010.

In 2019 he won 58% of our vote beating Labour by over 17,000 votes. He was a Remainer.

He refused to inform his constituents whether or not he supported Boris Johnson in the party's No-Confidence Vote. Alec was a strong supporter of Liz Truss in the Leadership Battle.

As PM Liz Truss promoted him to an MoD Ministerial post in Sep '22, which he then quit / was sacked after 49 days, the same length of time his boss lasted in post.

Mike Completes Triathalon Raising £1000s for Brain Disorders

Bardsey Retiree, Mike Bosomwoth has just completed the Iron Triathlon (Ironman) for the Yorkshire Brain Appeal. It consists of a 2.4 mile swim, 112 mile cycle and a marathon to finish off (26.2 miles). He explains what has motivated a man in his 70th year to do this:

"Eight years ago I cycled into San Francisco having cycled across America and four years ago I cycled across Canada. On both of these rides I raised money for brain research. Rolling forward, one month ago I was cycling in Mallorca and two weeks ago in North Wales for pleasure. I am extremely lucky to be mentally and physically still able to ride a bike. There are many people, who because of physical or mental disability, cannot do so.

Brain disorders can rob people of both their mental and physical ability. Dementia not only does that, but it also takes away a person's memories and dignity. As a retired Clinical Scientist I know how important research is in trying to defeat brain disease."

These anonymous people succeeded in one post being denied to the group's 26,000 members — it was a totally innocuous post providing information about the trailers at Wetherby Racecourse, a cartoon poking fun at Trump and asking what Alex Shelbrooke's position is on the Boris Johnson vote (as there was nothing on his social media about it)

Thankfully, admin of the Grumbler group realised this was an untenable position in a free country and say future posts will be allowed.

In the past we have thanked them in these pages and in Christmas cards (see right) for the hard work and the time it takes to go through all the messages on this important forum for the community. It must be a thankless task at times.

But each post must be approved or otherwise on an individual basis. Or a detailed explanation provided with examples as to why a person deserves an outright ban. That is only right and fair.



There are important principles at stake here. We must not give in to over-sensitive people who cannot deal with criticism or bullies who simply wish to deny others free speech because they don't want people to know the truth. We wonder why these anonymous people don't engage in civilised debate on the issues, either in these pages or on social media. They are a group who prefer to spend their time shooting the messenger instead of using their energy to raise standards for the good of the whole town. Perhaps it is because we will question their general waffle which they usually cannot substantiate with facts. All our opinions are based on facts we can prove. Otherwise we would look foolish and if defamatory, we would be sued.

We repeat ad nauseum that we give EVERYONE the chance to say what they want unedited in these pages. So it is suspicious that our opponents do not write to us with their arguments.

We thank Suella for reminding us all of our innate right to freedom of expression. We hope some of her supporters who criticise us will think about what free speech is before pressurising the admin of social media groups to ban people. Think about how serious that action is - it leads to an authoritarian country, like Russia and China.

WFP will keep going because many of our 1000s of readers tell us they forward to every issue and what a good job we are doing.

Bus Cuts in Leeds & Huddersfield

First Bus, who used to run our X98/99 service, are cutting many early morning and evening services in Leeds & Huddersfield from Mon 3 July. Bad news for passengers.



Fares Clarified

The *First Bus* increase in some fares does not affect Wetherby passengers. A *Daysaver* costs £4.50 and can take you to Hebden Bridge, Holmfirth, Hemsworth, Heckmondwyke, Hebden Bridge & Haworth ie any bus within West Yorkshire. This ticket can be bought on the bus with cash.

It has just been announced that the £2 maximum single fare will increase to £2.50 on 31 October and stay at that price for a year until November 2024.

Spoons Rumours continue


