Danger Near Primary Schools

West Yorkshire Police have attended *St Marys Church Primary School* in Boston Spa 'following concerns raised by local residents regarding parking during drop off and pick up time'.

They say they will continue to carry out patrols outside schools when needed to prevent dangerous parking and ensure safety for all.

In response on social media, Hollie K said that *St James Primary School* on Hallfield Lane "was really bad at pick up today, was at a stand still with a coach and people refusing move into a space because it's too small or wasn't one available because of parked cars which has gotten worse since the parking charges were introduced. We also haven't had a lollipop lady for 2 going on 3 years and the road is beginning to be quite dangerous for the children always was but no lollipop lady is ridiculous and, yes, we have told the council but it's falling on deaf ears".

None of our Town Councillors have yet expressed support for this campaign. Age UK have a similar one.




Goosemoor - A Relaxing Place to View Some Wildlife



Poor Customer Experience on Harrogate Bus Co's 7

A reader has brought an incident to our attention. We were surprised as *Harrogate Bus Company (HBC)* drivers are better than most. We sent the following email to customer services and others at *HBC*:

To Henri Rohard, MD of *Transdev*,

Good Morning Mr Rohard,

Your Oct 23 out-of-date timetables are still being displayed in Wetherby Library. They contain **WRONG** times about the X98/99 you no longer run.

We have told you about this previously, as well as Ben Gilligan of *Go-Ahead*, but nothing has been done.

We have received a disturbing email about an incident on your No 7 that happened on Tues 27 Jan. It looks like very poor customer service. Please comment.

"Yesterday the 8:30am Number 7 bus from Wetherby broke down on Thorp Arch Trading Estate.

A van driver told the bus driver there was something loose on the roof of the bus.

The bus driver rang through and a mechanic was coming from the depot in Starbeck. No thought was given to the passengers on the bus.

The bus driver told them the next bus was 4pm! The passengers had to fend for themselves.

Some called for taxis, some wandered off and one called her husband and he took two of them to Seacroft.

The lady who told me got a lift with the lady who called her husband. She is elderly and didn't know what to do. She didn't know where to go to catch another Number 7 bus.

It sounds as if it was very distressing for her and the bus driver was nice help.

It's quite shocking that no thought was given to the passengers!"

Mr Rohard has not responded, nor any manager or customer services person from HBC / Transdev. They clearly don't care that their timetables are out-of-date in Wetherby Library and that they are misleading passengers with wrong times in them.

After the article in our last issue, there has been no reaction from Ben Gilligan of Go-Ahead (Procters) who run the X98/99 to Leeds.

No response either from Cllr Lamb to our many comments about his disappointing answers to the questions in Issues 86 & 87.

You have to ask yourself, do any of them really care about our bus services? They certainly are not keen on being accountable for their part in the low standards the passenger has to put up with. Meanwhile, after 4 years there's still nothing to stop the bus blocking on Castle Gate! See right.

Wetherby man becomes Vice-Chancellor of a University.
No mention of Kazia Knight's passing. We are speechless!



In the last issue we asked if there was anybody willing to speak up for this 'newspaper' and defend its lack of W'by news. One person on the *Nextdoor* social media forum gave his view. **'John W' writes:**

“ Whatever the shortcomings of the *Wetherby News* may be, its editor and staff do not launch and sustain a personal vendetta against anyone who dares to criticise the newspaper. This is the exact opposite of how the sole person responsible for publishing the *WFP* handles criticism. He names and shames anyone who has the temerity to criticise the content of the *WFP*. No dissent or disagreement is tolerated. Any individual who expresses a different opinion is dismissed, criticised or ridiculed by the self-appointed voice of Wetherby. Of course, the *WFP* person keeps a very careful record of anyone daring to express an opinion which he does not agree with. This ensures they will be dealt with accordingly, using *WFP* as his personal platform to attack what has become a long and increasing list of targets. For all its perceived faults, the *Wetherby News* does not engage in this type of persistent hounding of anyone who disagrees with its content or editorial policy. ”



The Editor replied: “ Thanks for your comment, John. Total nonsense of course. Not a single example provided. We welcome free speech, don't you? We deal with FACTS, otherwise we would get sued. You are someone else who defends a simply dreadful paper by attacking people who care about the community and want to improve it. We're grateful that not many people think like you. Why don't we meet up and talk about your grievance like normal adults, John? Plse DM me. ”

John W replied: “ As already indicated, the *WFP* person will not tolerate any dissent. He brooks no criticism. The *Wetherby News*, for all its alleged failings, does not chase after anyone who dares to disagree with its content or editorial policy. The publishers of local newspapers refrain from using their pages to hound local people who may have a different opinion, whoever they might be, by naming and shaming them. Whereas, the *WFP* person uses his own publication to persistently criticise those who live in the area. That includes people who help the local community. In addition, the supposedly discredited *Wetherby News* is likely to contain facts. Except they do not feel the need to shout about it. Perhaps the *WFP* person ought to consider demonstrating a little 'humility.' NB No doubt a dismissive response is being prepared for the next issue of his publication. ”

The Editor replied: “ Thanks again to John W for repeating the same strong views/nonsense. We welcome criticism and do not try and get it removed from sites like this. We also publish it in full and unedited, or would you prefer your views not to be in the next issue, Mr W? If not, why not? But it is very strange that John W does not expect us to defend ourselves against the nonsense he writes here. Quite bizarre that he expects to shoot the messenger and for the messenger to not react. He again provides no examples where the *Free Press* has criticised or 'chased' a person or organisation where it is unjustified. Not a single example! Nothing to back his opinion up. He clearly wants us to ignore incompetence, laziness, low standards and poor performance by those in high positions in Wetherby, especially those who spend OUR money. We suspect Mr W (why the anonymity? *Nextdoor* neighbours normally know each other's surnames) has been the subject of one of our 87 issues, or his (political) colleagues or friends have been. Plse come clean and tell us what affiliations you have, John. He does not wish to meet in person to discuss his grievance and explain in detail why he thinks what we have written is wrong. Isn't that the definition of a keyboard warrior? Mature *Nextdoor* neighbours get together over a coffee to sort their differences out. We do, of course, constantly highlight the positive in our area, something John W doesn't mention. Yours humbly, Paul ”

A summary of the facts.

- John W thinks that some people are above criticism, especially if they 'help the local community' (Jimmy Savile helped the community and raised £millions for charity!)
- He describes the *Wetherby News* as having 'alleged failings' and 'perceived faults' and is 'supposedly discredited'. He has no opinion on the paper but has very strong negative ones about a newsletter that will publish anything (legal) he would send it
- John W does not provide a single example to back his strong views up
- He expects us not to defend ourselves when he makes strong accusations (without any evidence)
- He refuses to criticise the Editor face-to-face, the definition of a keyboard warrior
- He refuses to say whether he has any affiliations so we don't know if he is in a position of authority in the town

We asked him to confirm if he is the senior Wetherby Lion, John Wardley. He refused to say. We asked John Wardley and got no response either. The only other supporter of the *Wetherby News* (and fierce critic of us) is a senior *Lions* member and in the 4 years of our existence, the local *Lions* groups have never sent us any details of their good deeds to publicise. That is up to them but we're allowed to wonder why.

Judge for yourselves who is being reasonable here. We hope that whoever John W is he will meet up for coffee and get to know the Editor as a person. Perhaps he'll write an article for us one day and together we can try and improve the only community newsletter we have.


More West Yorkshire Police Committing Sackable Offences

The BBC have reported that the number of *West Yorkshire Police* officers and staff committing sackable offences has risen more than fivefold in five years.

Almost a third of the offences were sexual or domestic in nature and included crimes such as rape and possessing indecent images of children, a BBC Freedom of Information request has found.

Det Ch Supt Tanya Wilkins, who is head of *West Yorkshire Police's Professional Standards Directorate*, said the force was "investigating more criminal and conduct matters than ever before" and attributed the rise to increased reporting. She also said the rise was "not necessarily due to any increase in corruption or decline in standards".

High-profile cases, including the murder of Sarah Everard by serving police officer Wayne Couzens in 2021, and that of serial rapist and former *Metropolitan Police* officer David Carrick, have placed police conduct under renewed scrutiny.

"The murder of Sarah Everard in 2021 and events after have, rightly so, placed a focus on internal culture in the police," she added.

Alison Lowe, West Yorkshire's Deputy Mayor, said: "The officers and staff who should never have been appointed in West Yorkshire, one by one, are being exited through the misconduct processes that are improving year on year."

Lowe said it was "inevitable that rogue officers and staff will be recruited because no system, no process of recruitment, is perfect".

The rise in gross misconduct cases represented a "change in culture," she added. "I think there is a culture of misogyny, of racism, of homophobia because, of course, policing is a microcosm of the society in which we all live."

'No confidence in WYP Professional Standards', says Resident

Promise not kept

A resident says he is not surprised at these rising figures after his experience with the 'Professional Standards of WYP'. He has no respect for, or confidence in them after he simply wanted to know why a senior Officer refused to contact him after he said he would.

We described this poor behaviour in Issues 76, 78, 79 & 82 last year. The resident had a meeting about the serious issue of harassment with Insp Richard Armstead of Leeds North East Division, who assured him he would look into the serious issues raised and get back to him. The Officer later wrote "I have not forgotten about this so I will get back into it next week". He never contacted the resident. After repeated requests, the resident felt he had no choice but to write to the Chief Constable and Prof. Standards, not wanting to go through the official complaints procedure, and the hassle that would entail.

"What a total farce that was" he writes. "PC Ellis Adams of Prof. Standards Dep't seemed to be a spokesman for Insp Armstead, not an independent monitor of his behaviour. He made ridiculous explanations on his behalf, which made no sense. He was basically saying it was ok for *West Yorks Police* to ignore and 'cancel' a resident. I was dumbfounded. The Deputy Mayor & Chief Constable were not interested either"

The Free Press highlighting this issue had no effect - nothing followed from the Inspector, the resident says. We checked and he is still our local Inspector. This behaviour lets the public down, and all the many decent, professional staff. If you cannot trust a senior Police Officer to keep his word, who can you?


We are not surprised that these details are kept from us. We have shown in many past issues they are more secretive than MI6.

- ◆ details and invoices of each individual item of expenditure that exceeds £500.
- ◆ details of every invitation to tender for contracts to provide goods and/or services with a value that exceeds £5,000.
- ◆ details of any contract, commissioned activity, purchase order, framework agreement and any other legally enforceable agreement with a value that exceeds £5,000.

How Other Places in Yorkshire Improve Their Environment



Survival Looks Good - 6 Pts above Drop



Three months ago fellow-strugglers Notts Forest beat Leeds 3 - 1. This time it went the other way with a fine performance at Elland Road by the Whites. This was a crucial 'must-win' match - the pressure was on Daniel Farke and his team. Leeds had some lady luck when Chelsea missed an open goal in the last minute. Some tough challenges ahead from the likes of Man City and Aston Villa.




