This table does not tell us how much work is carried out by councillors but it is an indication of their dedication to the role.

We have asked these councillors individually what sort of time and effort is involved in being a councillor but no written answers were provided.

Being a councillor is a voluntary, unpaid role. But it is a responsible post, overseeing the expenditure of many £10,000s of our money and making decisions about planning matters, parks, town events & contracts.

Normally we would write to Councillors Maltby and Bennett to ask them if there is a reason for their poor attendance. They have not responded to any of our emails previously so we will not waste our time. They have a right of reply and if they wish to use it, we will publish it in equal prominence on next issue's front page.



Residents need to know is crime getting better, worse or staying the same. And how it compares to previous years.


Councillors or police are not reporting their discussions on this basic analysis, assuming they are discussing it.

Criticism from a Councillor!

We were astounded to find a hint of criticism in WTC meeting minutes. This has never happened before to our knowledge. In



November's meeting Cllr Chapman 'lamented a lack of specific detail given on reported crimes' at Police & Communities Together (PACT) meetings.





Following our report in the last issue, BBC Look North broadcast an item by Spencer Stokes on the bus situation in North Yorkshire (we send Spencer, Look North & Calendar our newsletter in the hope they will take up stories, like this).

The 840 York to Whitby was featured and locals were interviewed saying how vital the service is. As we stated, the bus is not just for tourists, it is a lifeline for many residents.

Over 80 important routes are at risk in the county when funding ends in March.

The online petition was also mentioned and has now reached over 3000 signatures. It's at https://t.co/3N62L4T1Lq

Let's hope the government and councils can find a way to continue supporting these services. We're still not sure where the £3Bn Boris promised for buses went.

And let's hope more people use these services. The national £2 single fare can get you from York to Whitby on the most scenic bus ride in Britain! This fare ends on 1 April.

Just a week after the Editor witnessed a vehicle holding a bus up, it happened again. This time the bus driver got out, took a photo and exchanged a few words with the van driver.

The Editor wrote to the same people as last time (bus co's, a cllr, Metro/ WYCA informing them of these facts with the photo and gave his opinion that this is clearly a common occurrence.

Cllr Lamb replied saying that it should be reported to the Police. He has asked Leeds City Council officers to review the situation but said it "will take a while if they decide to change anything".

The Editor felt it unnecessary to report it to the Police as the driver was obviously going to report it to his managers at Harrogate Bus Company and presumably they would do so. The Editor thought it more effective to inform those who could deal with the cause not the effect.

Brown signs on A1 will soon just be saying 'town' instead of 'market town'

Only 4 Stalls turning up is simply an embarrassment. Regular customers who turn up must be very disappointed and go elsewhere next time.

The Wetherby Free Press highlighted the lack of stalls just a couple of weeks before Christmas.

It was not discussed at the last Town Council general meeting or any Welcome to Wetherby meeting. Worse still, it's not on the agendas of their January meetings.

What are they doing to stop this sad decline in our 'thriving, vibrant' town? Something must be done and quickly.

This drew a large reaction of more than 100 comments on Wetherby Grumbler. One resident confirmed our fears with this post: "When we were shopping in town yesterday, we were talking to a group of people that had specifically travelled in for the market. Needless to say, they were very disappointed."

But some say 'Problem, what problem?'

For example, it was claimed **this was normal for January**. So we asked the folk of Otley on social media how busy their market was on that day, a Friday.

An Otley stallholder told us: "There were 12 stalls today on Otley market , only 3 stalls missing which were plants , shoes and fish. We were busy for January and fully stocked up."

An Otley resident told us: "Friday is always a much quieter market day in Otley - nothing like a Saturday. But we were there today and there were a good few stalls despite the month and weather. Lots of people bustling about too."

Another said: "Market was busy on Tuesday when I was down there."

So it appears that it is not normal to be virtually deserted in January. And don't forget Otley can manage 3 markets a week (Tues, Fri & Sat). Why do they do so much better than us (in this and many other ways)?

Some said it was the weather. The weather was not that bad. How come 4 stalls took the 'risk', if indeed there was a risk with wind? The weather was very good on the 2 Thursdays before Christmas when many stalls were missing, see image below.

Other helpful and informed comments from Wetherby & area residents were:

"I've managed a stall as a volunteer for Yorkshire Air Ambulance. I have to say the equipment provided is very old and essential equipment in short supply. Large clips for holding the tarps in place. Stall holders bring their own. Sadly, the shabby look of the councils stalls are not very appealing. Some businesses have to bring their own. Come on Wetherby,

support your market better and promote its value to the community."

"The stall rental in Wetherby is renowned for overcharging. So stallholders have told me and it's that that makes it not worthwhile."

"Parking can be an issue in Wetherby. The Riverside car park is full all day with cars that people have parked there and then gone to get the bus to work, probably Leeds. I have always thought that that car park should have a time limit on it."

"We travel from Boston Spa to buy from the twins (at Knaresborough market) who have the fruit and veg stall. Their quality is very good and prices fair."

Others suggested the market should be on a weekend and that young people



are not interested resulting in a continual decline.

We did not notice any comments from any of our councillors. We have to ask ourselves whether they care. We can



only hope that they take note of people's comments and discuss it at Council meetings as a **standing agenda item**. We asked @WetherbyMarkets on Twitter for comment - No Response.

We noticed that Otley received a lot of publicity for the town with their New Year's Dip. Looking at the photos on their Facebook Group, see right, a lot of people took part and a great time was had by all (and charity money raised).

The Editor & partner had a walk by the Wharfe here on 1 Jan and it was quiet with a couple of coffee shops open.

The Wetherby Free Press raised this a year ago in Jan 2022, see right. There are many benefits: showing community spirit, benefit refreshment businesses, possible coverage on

Look North & Calendar, especially if it was linked to the campaign to stop sewage discharges.

It seems to us that we don't do enough to celebrate our greatest natural asset, the River Wharfe. So we asked on social media what people thought of a Wetherby Big Dip.

There will always be reasons/excuses not to do something and the main one is the pollution in the river; it's not healthy. Our response would be that it's the same river as Otley and just as polluted; we're all adults and can decide for ourselves whether it is worth the risk.

We asked the town's organisations what they thought and were pleasantly surprised that we received a response from most of them. The Lions say they "do not have the Health & Safety expertise in the Club to manage such an event safely given the potential hazards" and are busy with other events at this time of year. The Wetherby Business Association will discuss it.

Sadly, the main body who should have the know-how and wherewithall to coordinate such an event has declined to take it forward. Wetherby Town Council / Welcome to Wetherby say it is "due to the natural hazards of open water swimming and the unpredictable nature of the river in winter". We say it is the same in Otley. It is a shame an opportunity may be lost to raise the profile of Wetherby, show its community spirit, raise money for charity, publicise poor water quality and most importantly, have some fun!



Alec Shelbrooke has been our Conservative MP for 12 years since May 2010. His basic salary is £84K (£2K rise in Apr '22). In the last election in 2019 he won 58% of our vote beating Labour by over 17,000 votes. He was a Remainer.

From Dec '19 to May '22 he has voted 467 times out of 560 (83%) and has rebelled once against the party whip (Mar '22). He refused to inform his constituents whether or not he supported Boris Johnson in the No-Confidence Vote. He was a strong supporter of Liz Truss in the Leadership Battle. She promoted him to an MoD Ministerial post in Sep '22, which he then quit / was sacked within 2 months.

Computer viruses are a complete nightmare if you get one.

Wetherby Town Council send general emails out to their distribution list in this manner.

It's poor etiquette (and lazy) if they cannot spend a few seconds putting a title in. They should inform the many recipients of the main subject - that is what the title box is for. Then if the topic does not interest us, we don't waste our time opening it.


