We looked on the website and social media accounts of Wetherby Business Association (WBA) for any comment about the current state of affairs with so many businesses closing. We found none. We looked for anything the organisation is doing to make the empty premises look more attractive but found nothing. They have managed only one tweet so far this year!

'Irresponsible' Post about River by Linda Richards

Former Conservative Councillor, Linda Richards posted on Wetherby Grumbler Facebook page (27,700 members): "WANT A CLEANER RIVER WHARFE? We need a mass paddle/

swim in the River Wharfe near the bandstand on Sun Sept 3, and Mon Sept 4. We need over 100 people on each day.

Can you be there 2 pm or 3 pm to show how the river is used and is so important to our community? It has to be swimmers or paddlers (walking or playing in the river) I'm afraid, but it doesn't need to be for long. Children are especially welcome. Use the last days of summer holidays to create a positive change."

Leeds City Councillor (Green) Penny Stables responded: "It is highly

irresponsible to encourage people into the river Wharfe whilst we know it is dangerously polluted with raw sewage and run off from farmers fields. We all want a cleaner river Wharfe

that is safe for all to enjoy, but there are other ways to achieve this." The Editor responded to Mrs Richard's post with "Very strange that Linda does not mention the Wetherby & Villages Clean Rivers Group in this post. Has it disbanded after we featured it in last issue of Wetherby Free Press? The group does not have a constitution, has a poor website compared to Ilkley's and Linda still has not apologised for posting blatantly political tweets on the Group's Twitter feed." Linda has not responded to any of the questions or issues we have raised and she deleted our response to her Grumbler post.



People should be fully aware that our river is polluted and therefore the decision whether to paddle or swim in the Wharfe is entirely at your own risk.

What is interesting is the language and tone of Linda Richard's post. She says 'can you' and 'Use the' and 'we need' twice. There is not a single 'please' or 'thank you', or 'could you' or 'we would like'. It sounds harsh and gives the impression that people ought to do what she says.

Is this the same sort of attitude we have seen before from councillors (always Conservative) in their refusal to answer legitimate questions? - it's as though they think 'why should we answer your questions or apologise to you?'

The answer is, of course, because I am a taxpaying resident. No surprise she deleted our perfectly reasonable response to her post.

Time change for Knaresborough Bus, Mon-Fri only

Connexions Managing Director Craig Temple has written another column for Buses magazine.

It says nothing relevant to passengers of his services in Wetherby.

We offered him a free column in WFP but he declined.

It looks like he prioritises bus enthusiasts over his passengers and our readers. We would like to know what he is



doing to get our York & Otley Saturday services back.

Harrogate Bus Company

(Transdev) have changed the times of two buses on their route 8 to Knaresborough via Kirk Deighton & Little Ribston.

The changes affect late afternoon journeys on Monday to Friday only.

The last bus from Knaresborough at 16.21 now leaves 20 minutes later at 16.41

The last bus from Wetherby at 16.55 now

leaves 20 minutes later at 17.15. Saturday times remain the same.

On the face of it this seems a good thing - more time for visits, shopping and afternoon drinking in 'Spoons etc. But why not Saturday as well, Paul Turner, Commercial Director? Keep it simple Transdev, please. No explanation for these changes on their website. And it means that Transdev's Wetherby leaflet featured in the last issue needs updating. The new timetables were NOT available from the library 5 days after the change was introduced. This route will always be vulnerable to cuts so PLEASE use it.

3 Die in Bus Crash on A61 near Ripon

A horrific accident happened on Sun 3 Sept involving 2 cars and a double-decker bus at South Stainley between Harrogate & Ripon. Bus passengers were also treated for injuries. Local and national media reported this but there were no details of the bus involved. There is only one passenger route using that road and it is the H'gate Bus Co's 36 Leeds to Ripon. Readers may remember a bus crash in Wetherby involving a Harrogate Bus Company bus in July 2021. A wall of silence followed the incident, in which the no 7 ploughed into the Paper Shop, thankfully missing pedestrians. The apathy of our local councillors (Conservative) means the public will probably never be told exactly what happened.

Reminder of Important Bus Facts (to inform our councillors)

- ♦ Transdev's route 7 to Leeds via B Spa was reduced to hourly from half-hourly in Nov '22
- The late night route 7 service from Harrogate at 11.30pm was cut in Nov '22. The last bus is now 10.20pm
- There is NO Saturday service to York (Connexion's route 412) or Otley (Connexions route 923)
- ♦ There are no evening services to York

- ♦ Wetherby has old and new bus stop flags, and dirty cases with minimal information.

It happened in the early hours of Thursday 31 Aug when it was closed and no staff were on site. A vehicle rammed into the



My wife and I see a stoat / weasel occasionally on our countryside walks around Wetherby.

The Woodland Trust says the easiest and most reliable way to tell a stoat from a weasel is the tail. A stoat's tail is around half the length of its body and ends in a bushy black tip. A weasel's tail is short and stubby by comparison and solely brown in colour.

Stoat or Weasel?

They often dart across footpaths so you have to be quick to spot which it is. Both are thought to be common but difficult to count. Numbers are estimated to be around 450,000 of each. Climate Emergency Ctte (minuted by Barry Riley, Deputy Clerk)- A member of the public referred to comments submitted to him concerning the efficacy of the Committee, that not enough was being done by the Council and what could be achieved going forward. He suggested that the use of volunteer groups would help deliver aspects of the action plan and meetings about climate change were

likely to be more productive than this Committee meeting. In other words, the resident thinks the committee is ineffective, as indeed we do. What has it achieved of note? Where is an Annual Report for this group clearly describing achievements and their associated costs? A sentence contained 'Wetherby in Villages, clean river group'. They mean 'Wetherby & Villages Clean River Group'. Low standard of minuting again.

Welcome to Wetherby (minuted by Barry Riley, Deputy Clerk) — There had been a delay in the printing of the visitor leaflet. No reason given. Another example of poor minuting. Why can't they provide any detail? To hide the embarrassment of incompetence? How long has this simple leaflet taken to produce, over a year? More on this leaflet in next Issue.

No progress on Wetherby Pride No reason given. No consultation on social media. Suggestion of screening Glastonbury. Hopefully they will consult us on this suggestion.


Local Author Written New Book about the Wharfe

Johno Ellison from Boston Spa was interviewed recently by Cathy Killick for BBC Look North about his new book. It is called "Walking the Wharfe - An Ode to a Yorkshire River". We asked him to tell us more:

"I grew up in Boston Spa and have always been a bit enchanted with the River Wharfe as I have lots of different connections to it. My family come from different places along the river; I was based at RAF Church Fenton near the river downstream when I was younger and I even worked in the (former) Three Legs pub in Wetherby for a while.

So I decided to walk the entire length of the river. My wife's a teacher (she's from Menston, also near the river, upstream) and she got offered a job abroad about ten years ago. So I thought that the river walk would be a good way for me to send off Yorkshire, and see its beauty for one last time. I did the walk and we duly moved to Kuala Lumpur but then, a few years ago, I found an old book by a Victorian author from

Edmund Bogg. He had completed the same route as me, but at the end of the 1800s. I devoured his book and then I developed the fascination again. I decided to rewalk the route again, retracing Edmund Bogg's footsteps from 120 years earlier and seeing what has changed and what's stayed the same.

I spent five days walking about 95 miles (the river is about 65 miles but I had lots of detours to see interesting things nearby) from the Wharfe's Mouth in the flat Vale of York, all the way up in the wild Yorkshire Dales where a tiny stream bubbles out of the bleak moor side on Cam Fell. I was carrying a tent and wild-camping along the way, just laying my head in out-of-the-way woods wherever I could. I found that although a lot of physical things had changed (for example, the RAF Church Fenton airbase was all fields when Edmund Bogg did his walk - planes had only just been invented and the Wright Brothers did their first flight around the time his book came out), you still had this Yorkshire warmth and wit running through history. Halfway through the walk I found myself walking into Appletreewick - in the Dales - in the middle of a storm with blowing wind and sideways rain. As I walked into the village it appeared totally deserted and pitch black, with no light or people anywhere. Eventually I came to the pub, which also looked totally closed down. Thankfully the door swung open and as I walked in what felt like the whole village were inside, all illuminated by candlelight. They all went silent and turned to face me, like some kind

of horror film, but then the landlady quickly explained that there'd been a powercut all along the valley, as she pressed a pint of hand-pulled ale into my hand and offered me a place by the roaring fire. A true Yorkshire welcome!"

This is the second book about Yorkshire we have featured (previously the excellent Yorkshire - Ancient Nation, Future Province by Colin Speakman). Johno's book sounds like a darned good read too and well worthy of consideration for the Christmas list. We wish Johno well and hope the book is a great success. He refused to inform his constituents whether or not he supported Boris Johnson in the party's No-Confidence Vote. Alec was a strong supporter of Liz Truss in the Leadership Battle.

As PM Liz Truss promoted him to an MoD Ministerial post in Sep '22, which he then quit / was sacked after 49 days, the same length of time his boss lasted in post.

In June 2023 Alec voted for the Privileges Committee report which stated that Boris Johnson repeatedly misled parliament ie knowingly lied about parties in Downing Street whilst the rest of us had to follow the rules.

Statement regarding Financial/Business Status of WFP & Editor's Business

The Editor has addressed this before but we'll repeat it here to answer a recent question on social media.

"The newsletter is published on my business website for PK Marketing, because it costs me nothing to do so. The newsletter is free to the public and takes up a lot of time. Of course, if advertisers want to promote themselves to our large readership, there is no reason why I should not make some money from that, like our dreadful local paper does, given how much time and effort the WFP takes to produce. I am not a charity and have bills to pay.

But our critics may be pleased to know that I have never made a penny from the venture. The satisfaction of informing the public of how those in authority behave (and how our public money is being spent) must be payment enough. And it is.

You can clearly see from the current number of adverts that it is not enough to cover printing costs. Hence our move to printing it ourselves and becoming less frequent. Hence, describing it as 'not for profit' is 100% accurate.

I am a self-employed sole trader with the name PK Marketing. Details at www.pkmarketing1.com. Nothing to hide but if you find anything suspicious or dodgy, please feel free to tell us and the world.

Social media user and Wetherby News reader Steve Cooper carried out some research on me in May 2022 and found another business called PK Marketing in the UK, a limited company. He asked on Nextdoor social media community whether my using this name is 'classed as a criminal act or just a civil law tort'? Despite his contacts in the Lions, over a year later I have heard nothing further about this - no knock on the door from the police or a solicitor's letter. It would be nice if Mr Cooper could explain why he asked this question and why there has been no follow up. At the time we asked him to write an article about his concerns for the WFP. He declined.

There are 2 'Meet the Editors' in the coming months and I hope Mr Cooper, and anyone else who seems to have a problem with the Editor / WFP, will come along in person and discuss their issues in a civilised manner in a safe environment.

People should realise that common sense and the truth will always win in the end. I sleep soundly at night because I know I have done nothing wrong. The WFP has written tens of thousands of words and nobody has sued us, or even threatened to. That is because we stick to the facts, provide honest opinion (based on those facts) and, of course, our articles are in the public interest.



Despite our offer of printing anything individuals or organisations send us, there's a conservative, small-minded, over-sensitive rump of our town who will not engage with us and many try to shoot the messenger instead.
