Last 2 Banks Closing in 2025

Both Lloyds & Halifax Banks are to close on 13 January next year. This will leave no banks left in Wetherby. We have just 3 building societies, Leeds, Skipton & Yorkshire. Along with Wetherspoons backing out of the town, and many other businesses closing in recent times, this shows that Wetherby is not immune to the changing face of our high streets.

A spokesperson said "As many customers now choose to bank through their mobile app or online, visits to our Lloyds Bank and Halifax branches in Wetherby have fallen over recent years. Customers can use the local Post Office for everyday banking or at the new Banking Hub once it is up and running."

The hub will be operated by Post Office staff, and customers of any bank can withdraw and deposit cash, make bill payments and other regular transactions. Knaresborough has such a hub. cont'd on Page 6

officers are attacked on an almost daily basis resulting in many being sent to A&E and having time off work to recover. Many leave the job. Kettles provided to inmates to make hot drinks are smashed and the elements sharpened to use as a stabbing implement. Sugar is boiled with water to throw over officers to ensure excruciating burns on bare skin . For many of the "children" on life sentences the worst punishment you can get is to have your TV taken away for a period of time.

New Season Starts - All Aboard the DalesBus



The Summer 2024 Season of DalesBus starts on 31 March and the network runs until late October.

Wetherby is fortunate enough to have a bus direct to Upper Wharfedale every Sunday. No changes necessary and only £2 per journey, an absolute bargain.




The Wetherby to Knaresborough 8 bus timetable will remain unchanged when Transport 21 take it over from Sun 7 April

New Transdev App from 1 April (no joke!)

We can criticise Harrogate Bus Company (Transdev) for their decisions and unwillingness to answer simple questions but they excel in passenger literature, and their app is extremely useful too.

It can tell you exactly where your bus is, as the image shows. This gives passengers almost total confidence the bus will turn up at the time the app says. The Metro real



time system at bus stops is simply not to be trusted. Buses still disappear from the screen.

Their new app starts from Easter Monday so don't forget to upload it and delete the old one on your smartphone.



Reminder of Bus Facts

- Transdev's route 7 to Harrogate & Leeds via B Spa was reduced to hourly from half-hourly in Nov'22
- The late night route 7 service from Harrogate at 11.30pm was cut in Nov '22. The last bus is now 10.20pm
- There is NO Saturday service to York (Connexion's route 412) or Otley (Connexion's route 923) since May 22
- There is not a single bus shelter on the Aire Road/Ainsty Road estate or on Spofforth Hill
- We have old and new WYCA/Metro bus stop flags. Many stops have dirty cases and poor information.
- WYCA/Metro have stopped printing their 7 invaluable network maps

We ask "What will change?". 15% of journeys already subsidised. Will cut services be reinstated, like 923 to Otley & 412 to York on Saturdays before 2027? And will the no 7 to Leeds go back to half-hourly?

Campaigner Doug Paulley was on screen for 15 seconds and mentioned bus timings, overcrowding and the fact a number of local



buses had been cut.

every aspect of their private business.

Bus company boss Craig Temple was again expressing his fear that the smaller companies, like his, would have to wait 5 or 7 years to bid for another contract again, if unsuccessful the first time.

We have put both sides of the argument – the option of Franchising or Enhanced Partnership plus (EP+). We have highlighted the failings of Metro/WYCA in many of our articles eg leaking bus station roof, no printed bus maps, allowing X99 changes etc.

Now the whole network will be put into the hands of politicians and Metro/WYCA at a massive cost to taxpayers. The EP+ model was rejected although it was a lot cheaper and meant working with the bus operators, not controlling

You have none of this nonsense in most parts of Germany. They have the boring system of regular, reliable, reasonably-priced buses that hardly ever change timetables, run early mornings and late into the night and actually integrate with local rail services.

We can but hope this massive shake-up is worth the many many £millions spent on the bureaucracy, but one thing Mayor Tracy Brabin stated clearly – "WE WILL BE ACCOUNTABLE FOR THE WHOLE NETWORK." We must keep her and the well-paid executives at Metro/WYCA to their word.

No Mention of Buses in Tory Election Newsletter

Conservative Cllr Lamb is a board member of Metro /

WYCA and against the Labour policy of franchising. In the Conservative newspaper delivered to all houses recently, we were surprised to see **not** a **single article about buses** - a large issue for him and the town, as we have no train service.

Yet there were no fewer than **4 articles** that were related to motorists / roads! It's clear from this that the Conservatives are targeting the motorist vote and that bus passengers are not as important.

We were surprised to see Penny Stables and Anna Jacobs of the Greens also wanting to help the motorist with their opposition to the introduction of parking charges in Wetherby. It seems strange to us that the environmentally-conscious Green Party took this pro-motorist stance.

West Yorkshire has the least satisfied bus passengers in the country. Only 73% were satisfied with their experience. That is a quarter who were not satisfied.

MP Alec Shelbrooke

Alec Shelbrooke has been our Conservative MP for nearly 14 years since May 2010.

In 2019 he won 58% of our vote beating Labour by over 17,000 votes. He was a Remainer.

Alec is one of Liz Truss' biggest supporters. As Prime Minister she promoted him to a ministerial MoD post in Sep '22, which he then quit/was sacked after 49 days, the same length of time she lasted.

He is therefore using X/Twitter purely to provide information and promote himself/his party - he wants no dialogue. We asked him if it is fair that he then uses the same platform to comment on others who do not have any such restrictions in place? And then deny them a right to reply? No response from him or his supporters.

Tweet 2. Claiming that he and local Councillors and representatives from Link have "secured a banking hub for Wetherby town". Their involvement was not mentioned in the Lloyds/Halifax/LINK press release. Surely, the banks were going to set this up anyway, like they have in other towns. Wetherby is a wealthy area and not to have any banking facilities would be unthinkable. We are not sure exactly what Alec is taking credit for here.

We note there are no tweets directly supporting Rishi Sunak or commenting on the recent Tory scandal (Hestor) or MPs quitting.

Where's the C-word (Conservative) in Election Paper?





It is quite amusing that this promotional publication does not state the word 'Conservative' in a single article. Yet the first word of the first article is 'Labour'.

Surely the Conservatives are not afraid or ashamed of using their own party's name? It says to us that they want to distance themselves from their own party in government. What other reason is there?

They put the C-word in the smallest font possible on the front page and on the back page in the about us box.

Clir Lamb only mentions once that he is the Leader of the Conservatives, though he uses the word 'opposition' on Leeds City
Council but does not inform us anything about that work. It must take up a great deal of his time that is not spent on Wetherby issues.

Of course, nobody can deny Cllr Lamb works hard on many different local issues but it's the issues that are not mentioned that we notice eg

bus blocking at Wetherby Bus Station, which has being going on for over 2 years now, see pages 2 & 4.

It is what it is - a publication with a complete bias towards Cllrs Lamb and Harrington, giving no credit to Cllr Penny Stables for anything she's done. It shows total polarisation, despite the fact they are both anti-Labour.

It doesn't instil much confidence in the Councillors' attention to detail when two obvious spilling mistakes are not noticed and corrected. 'Noma' for Norma & 'Councilor' for Councillor

Material like this is funded by money donated by people like Frank Hester who has recently caused a furore after comments about Diane Abbott that PM Rishi Sunak said, eventually, were 'racist'. The Conservative party has refused to return any of the £15M reportedly given to them. In other words they think the comments were not serious enough to distance themselves financially from the person who made them. But they are serious enough for West Yorkshire Police to investigate.

Clir Lamb's election strategy seems to involve flooding social media with posts and messages. We have never seen so much Twitter/X and Facebook usage.

And when councillor colleagues and other supporters re-post his posts, it floods social media even more and causes frustration for many. It drowns out equally important information and views from ordinary people. This attempt at social media domination is counter-productive, as it annoys so many. Please take note councillors, less is more.

She takes her own clothes off in an attempt to strangle herself and end her life. The options are either leave her and get blamed for the suicide, or try and stop her and receive the headlines previously seen . I'll let your readers decide what they would do!

Media Coverage & Where's the Guvn'r?

We wanted to know what the person responsible for that institution thought, perhaps a comment or two defending his management regime. Surely they've said something!

So we googled "Wetherby YOI Governor" in the 'News' part to find out if he or she said anything. It gave us 6 results about the report from the media, including the BBC, Mirror, Yorkshire Post & Guardian.

But no comments from anybody at the establishment. The Yorkshire Post felt no need to name him or ask for comment. No mention of the report on the YOI's Twitter / X account either, see below.



The Governor's name is Peter Gormley. There is no picture of him anywhere online. He did not appear on TV. Why is he so anonymous? - he does not work for MI5 or MI6, though (even tho' one of them gives interviews now!)

Their last tweet about anything was on 30 Nov 2023. They have posted once on Facebook since 1 Feb regarding small grants. Their last news release on their website was about

Christmas. So nothing from them on how the loss of the banks will affect local businesses to their 1000+ followers




Better Wetherby Partnership Ltd reports that it now looks likely to be at least several months before they actually start building the first of the planned 762 new

homes on Racecourse Approach. Next to this site Persimmon Homes wish to build a further 130. The company submitted a formal application in Nov 2023.

Bradford paper, the T&A, reported that the "City of Culture 2025 has been awarded £6m by a West Yorkshire authority, despite a Wetherby councillor voting against the grant."

Cllr Lamb argued such events should not get public money. A report to members said the investment of £6m "represents very high value for money." but the Leeds Conservative Leader said "Bradford could use this money in much better ways at the minute."

Councillor Poulsen, the Conservative leader in Bradford, disagreed with her party colleague, saying: "I hope you will approve this funding, and I hope that it will benefit the whole of the Bradford district."

Meanwhile, Wetherby Town Council are going to produce their own newsletter at our expense. Do you think it will print (letters of) criticism of itself, like leaving the bus station off the town map?

Social media groups are no replacement for a newsletter / newspaper. We have experienced harassment and insults on the biggest Facebook group in

Wetherby, 'Wetherby Grumbler'. It is the Wild West and the Editor is pleased to be well out of it. The Group is flooded with posts of a similar conservative viewpoint and woe betide anyone who dares to disagree with them or provide opposing facts. The ordinary person's views are often drowned out. Social media is fleeting, not permanent and has far less significance than the permanent words in a newsletter / newspaper.

The main problem is that there is simply too much stuff on it. Very few of their 30,000 members will read the hundreds of posts and their comments every week. It's like having to read through the Times, the Sun, the Daily Mail and the Guardian every day to find something that interests you. A good exchange of views often descends into personal insults by the less intelligent and the cowards who hide behind anonymity / fake profiles. This give a bad impression of the town to newcomers and outsiders.



The administrators of Wetherby Grumbler could not monitor all the misinformation, insults, fake profiles and defamation aimed at the Editor so they took the easy way out and

censored him. His only crime was bringing legitimate grumbles to the table. You have to laugh at the irony of a Grumbler group banning

both sides. The local rag was read from cover to cover and the councillors made certain, if they wanted to be re-elected, that they fulfilled every public promise they made. Today there are no local papers to hold these people to account.

Instead, we receive an expensive

glossy quarterly mag, written by the council itself, trumpeting its own "successes". No questions asked.

It was a healthy relationship for both sides. The local rag was read



somebody for grumbling. Admin need to vet every member who crosses the line and uses the group to make personal insults.

There should be no anonymous accounts with pictures of pets instead of the actual person. It is cowardly to insult someone without showing your face. They should ask members to prove to them that they are not a fake profile. They should restrict members to 2 original posts a week unless it's useful live information, like road closures. They should stop duplicate posts about the same subject. We suggest residents join Nextdoor with its more civilised atmosphere and a more democratic complaints and reporting system.

Let's hope the smaller Facebook groups of the villages don't go the same way as Wetherby Grumbler. Social media is a great tool


for swopping local news and information but it must be properly monitored because there are many angry people who just resort to unacceptable language and insults.

Back to William Hague - a nice, honest, sensible person and a true Yorkshireman to boot. We will write to him and ask him for his opinion on our effort at making public figures accountable.

But more important is your support, which we greatly appreciate. The more intelligent of our readers realise that without an independent, influential means of allowing the public to have their say, we may as well live in Russia.



Wetherby Councillors - Still No Comment on Issues we Raise



We thank the 15 Wetherby Town Councillors for being unpaid volunteers. Most are Conservative & raised our Council Tax precept by 80% in a cost-ofliving crisis in 23/24, much of it to pay for new staff.

The Town Clerk is Iona Tayor. She is manager to an Assistant Clerk, a Communications & Events Officer Helena Briden, a Burials Manager and a Facilities Manager (vacant).

Work is also contracted out.

Employment costs are well over £150,000 a year.

There is still no up-to-date details of Town Hall staff on their website wetherby.co.uk; no images of staff (unlike Otley) and no easy-to-find diagram showing the line management structure. Why are they so reluctant to do this?

This is a Town Council that never feels the need to apologise when it makes mistakes. Councillors don't feel the need to make any comment or provide simple answers to reasonable questions from a resident of 30+ years. We were hoping for a change of culture and attitude when new independent councillors. But there has been no improvements that we have noticed, certainly in accountability.

- In recent months we have highlighted:

 * the substandard town leaflet with a map with the bus station missing no explanation or apology. Copies of old map still around town
 - * the Markets committee had NO councillors attend in Nov & Dec 2023 no explanation or apology in minutes
 - * the 2 Council meetings in last 6 months were 'inquorate' because not enough councillors turned up
 - * the substandard website unattractive, uninformative, user-unfriendly and vastly inferior to Otley's. The councillors' political party are still not stated, despite this being an extremely political council
 - * the Feb '24 election where the Conservatives spent a lot of effort and money on promoting their candidate, despite one of them claiming the Town Council is non-political
 - * the staff member complaining about WFP articles and emails without providing a single example to back up their complaint.

Councillors Produce Sub-standard Market Survey



As shown on the left, it seems our councillors can't count. There are 8 questions. Their '10' questions was stated on their social media too. How can we have any confidence in the survey when they make such a basic mistake? And why wasn't this obvious error noticed? Just like the bus station missing from the town map, nobody seems to check anybody else's work.

The Editor knows a thing or two about surveys having organised two national bus

There's surveys, one of which still attracts national publicity. Professional questionnaires do not ask people to rate on a scale of 1 to 10 for satisfaction, see right. Could anyone put in words the difference

between 6 & 7? The widely-used method is 5 options - Very Satisfied, Satisfied, Neither, Dissatisfied, Very Dissatisfied. Straight forward to analyse and present results.

4. On a scale of 1 to 10, how satisfied are you with Wetherby's Thursday market? 1 = Very Dissatisfied, 10 = Very Satisfied

The final question, no 8, does not include a text box for you to say what products or services you would like to see when you answer 'yes'. Why is it missing? Surely the Councillors want to know - it's one of the most important questions.

The survey is more like an official form eg "What is your age?" instead of "Please tell us your age". Nor do they: a) ask for your email so cannot send you summary of results b) tell you when and where you can find the summary of results c) have text boxes for 'comments on survey' or 'any other comments on Wetherby market?'

They do not even thank you for completing the survey! It's basic good manners. This shows the attitude and culture in this council - not to show any

gratitude for you taking the time and trouble to help them improve their service. Very disappointing. But not surprising. Next time they could consult an expert for free (the Editor).

More Erosion of Democracy and an Attempt to Restrict Free Speech?

We notice the Town Council is introducing a 'Vexatious Policy'.

We think they mean 'A Policy for Vexatious Questions/People'!

We found this definition of vexacious: "A vexatious complaint is one that is pursued, regardless of its merits, solely or primarily to harass, annoy, or subdue somebody. It refers to something that is unreasonable, without foundation, frivolous, repetitive, burdensome, or unwarranted. In other words, it's a complaint that lacks a valid basis and is driven by negative intent or an attempt to cause annoyance".

They give no reason for spending time on this. Why did this issue come up, we wonder. We have seen this before from another publicly-funded organisation.

We think it is purely a way of deterring people from making complaints and if they do, avoiding answering perfectly reasonable and legitimate questions. If this is their reason for introducing it, it is yet another attack on democracy and is another example of the Town Council and the Councillors avoiding any accountability to us, the electors.

We have raised many issues in WFP and not a single one has been frivolous, burdensome or any of the adjectives above. Most of these issues have been ignored by the Councillors despite all of

them clearly being in the public interest, and written as a resident of 30+ years

Of course, it's subjective so they can say a complaint is vexatious and dismiss it. Nobody independent will be involved in the complaints procedure in all likelihood so it's a bit like the water companies monitoring their own standards or like turkeys voting for Christmas.

We Were Right! Otley is Better

The Comms Ctte of Feb 24 states "Otley Town Council was identified as a good example of a website, in part due to the index of businesses." We told them that Otley's was far superior over a year ago but still virtually nothing has been done to address the issues we have raised, particularly the lack of basic information on the website. But then what hope is there of high standards when they quote 'Normington Town Council', not once but 3 times in

number of websites that were identified as good example on Council Normington Town Council, Otley Town Council committee AGREED that the format and visual design us

Council minutes (Jan mtg once, Feb mtg twice). Why was this error not noticed? Will we have similar basic errors on the new website? We asked Town Clerk, Iona Taylor these questions. Due to lack of space we have had to summarise her responses.

1 Why were the Communication Ctte meeting minutes that took place in October only approved in the March 2024 meeting 5 months later?

Council Response: No information in relation to this item.

2 In the Comm. Ctte mtg mins of Jan 24, it states that you "presented an infographic from Normington Town Council". Where is Normington? I googled it and there is no such place.

Council Response: Normington is an error and should read Normanton. I will ensure that this is corrected.

3 You produced cllr meeting attendance rates for the year in Dec 22 / Jan 23. The latest figures are already 2 - 3 months late. When will they be produced?

Council Response: The councillor attendance rates are being compiled and will be tabled at the Annual Town Council Meeting in May.

Does the Town Clerk mean April? The Annual Town Meeting is on 8 April. See left.

4 There is no mention of the Wetherby Business Association in either the Markets Ctte, Comms Ctte or Welcome to Wetherby Ctte. Why was there no involvement from the WBA in the Markets survey for businesses. Or any involvement in the new website when businesses are going to be added?

Council Response: The WBA Chair is invited to each meeting of

Welcome to Wetherby. When they attend, their presence is noted in the minutes of the meeting. Where they table apologies, these are also shown in the minutes of the meeting. No information in relation to why they were not involved in Markets survey or new website.

5 Why do you not

acknowledge the Wetherby Free Press in your minutes but do acknowledge the one from Better Wetherby Partnership Ltd?

Council Response: The Council has a rep on BWPL. No information in relation to why they do not acknowledge WFP.

We thank the Town Clerk for her responses. But readers can see where she is not able to answer simple questions. It is disappointing to see a lack of reassurance that she will try to ensure mistakes are kept to a minimum, and maybe even apologise for them.
