Our Highlight of 2023

Domination of a town by one political party is not a desirable thing,

whatever party it is. We need open discussion and opposing views without which things get stale. As national politics has shown, the public want change as they realise nothing is improving on the important issues and our bills and taxes keep rising. Even small and large 'c' conservative Wetherby & area realised this when they voted in the area's first Green Party candidate onto Leeds City Council.

Penny Stables, right, won by a majority of over 1000 votes over Linda Richards. Issue 44 reported that Wetherby had the highest turnout in all of Leeds at 46%, thus proving there is no voter complacency at City Council level. We are pleased that Penny has fully

engaged with the Free Press and gave us a list of her priorities, which we will give a progress check after a year.

The low level of public interest in Town Council matters in 2022 was shown by nobody bothering to turn up for the Annual General Meeting. 2023 saw an improvement with 10 residents attending when an 80% increase in Council Tax precept was forced upon us, some said without a full and clear explanation. In 2022 the Council was all Conservative but since then many have resigned and there was an opportunity for the more independently-minded to contribute. The Editor has seen no obvious improvement in standards, communication or accountability yet but we have real hope in 2024 that improvements will be made when the new Councillors find their feet and voice.



Over 2 years until something has been done about this problem. Hallfield Lane and the Wattlesyke roundabout have been brought forward for resurfacing works. They are now marked for urgent attention, hopefully before the end of the current financial year.

Single-Use Plastic Free Status Assistant Clerk to audit all council work to identify where single use plastics are used and how they could be replaced by suitable alternatives. As a first step on this journey a milkman will deliver milk to the Town Hall in glass bottles from the start of 2024. It is not stated how extra much this will cost. cont'd in next issue

Leeds City Councillor Penny Stables (Green Party) is carrying out a survey to gather information about the provision of bus services to enable people to get to work. She has sent letters many businesses across Wetherby, Boston Spa & Thorp Arch.

She encourages all business owners and staff to complete the survey. "The more data we have the stronger our argument for

buses that get us where we want to go and arrive when we need to get there!", she says.

Connexions Boss Fears Closure if Franchising Happens

Local Bus Manager Craig Temple featured on BBC Look North expressing his fears about franchising which the Labour Mayor Tracy Brabin wants to bring in. He told reporter Spencer Stokes that the smaller independent bus companies could be wiped off the map as the bigger companies are usually awarded the contracts and his company Connexions would not be allowed to compete on the profitable routes. A consultation finishes soon on the Mayor's proposals. A decision is to be made in late Spring. Connexions currently run the 412 to York (not Saturdays) and the 923 to Otley (not Saturdays). Would you miss Connexions? Is it fair that the system of franchising means small, locally-based companies are not able to compete with multi-nationals owned by foreign investors? Tell us your views.


MP Alec Shelbrooke - Quiet about his Knighthood

No Comment from Conservative Councillors on Wetherby Grumbler

We looked on social media for praise from his supporters who must be extremely proud that their man has attained such high recognition.

There were 2 posts from Wetherby Grumblers (membership 29,000+) and one on Nextdoor. There were nearly 200 comments under them, the vast majority casting doubt on whether it was deserved. We found only one piece of praise for Alec from Peter & Kate Watson of Harewood, who said he

Two more things. The honours list says that they are proposals, leaving the impression they may not be approved by some committee or other. And it is odd to use the title "Sir" before King Charlie has put his sword on the man's shoulder to make it official, isn't it? Alec is using the title already, as seen in the image. Yet in every other way, Alec seems to want to keep quiet about it. There's nothing in the so-called 'Wetherby News' either. Wetherby Town Council Summary of December mtg mins continues in next issue



The 15 Wetherby Town Councillors are unpaid volunteers. Most are Conservative & raised our Council Tax precept by 80% in a cost-of-living crisis in 23/24, much of it to pay for new staff.

The Town Clerk is Iona Tayor.

The new Assistant Clerk is Rowann Fitzpatrick.

The new Communications Officer is Helena Briden.

These 3 salaries alone cost about £100,000 per year.

There is also a Facilities Manager, Steve Cohen.

Added to this much work is contracted out.

Would anybody like to compare staff costs to those of the village councils, and comparable town councils?


There is still no up-to-date details of Town Hall staff on their still awful website wetherby.co.uk: no images of staff (unlike Otley) and no diagram to show the line management structure.

Thanks to the keen eye of an interested reader we now have at least an idea of the management structure of our burgeoning Town Council. Our reader noticed the diagram on the right in the last Annual Report.

We note:

- ♦ The tiny pictures of staff make them hardly identifiable.
- This diagram should be on their website and updated when necessary, especially since:
 - * Barry Riley has left his post
 - * There should be an Operations Manager on it

Why are you promoting a local radio station on your Facebook page? See left. Social media is already flooded with posts so they must focus and stick to council business and other clearly important community information.

 Local Campaigner Mark Barrow took part in a documentary aired on BBC2 called 'Our Troubled Waters'. Presented by comedian and angler Paul Whitehouse, it shows the pollution allowed to take place in Lake Windermere & Rivers Wharfe & Tame.

 Mark says he spent 2 days filming with the celebrity and says it was 'a real honour' and that he is 'genuinely a really nike person'. The program started off with Mark & Paul by the Wharfe at Illely near the Water Treatment plant. While Mark prepared for at Illing either program attended for the admired Mark for being 'brave, intrepid and stupid' because of the danger from nastites in the water from salmonella to e coli:

 Later, Mark showed Paul footage of wet wipes, sanitary towels and human waste which he took in Collingham, Wethertys & Boston Spa. The first two the public must take some responsibility but raw sewage in our rivers is 100% Yorkshire Water's responsibility.
- * Bus driver highlights vehicles blocking station exit. Still nothing been done.
- * Employee stole over £64K from Floor Design.
- * No news about Wetherby in 'Wetherby News'. Library stopped buying it. They rarely feature our stories.

Town Council Election - Apply before Friday 12 Jan. Late Info from Council!



As we reported in the last issue, this election was instigated by a group of residents, 'not for any party political reason, but just to ensure that the democratic process is followed.'

The group would like to 'encourage people to stand for election' and wants 'to publicise this event as much as possible'.

The Spokesperson got back in touch with us to inform us that the Town Council website had nothing on it about this election in December. We checked and confirmed this. We also saw that the Town Council's Facebook feed did not mention it either. Their Twitter / X feed has not been used by them since April 2022.

A month after the application dates were confirmed, the Town Clerk sent an email out and put it on Facebook, just 10 days before the deadline.

Why has it taken so long for the Town Council to inform everybody of this election when we are assured they knew on 5 Dec the application date of 5 - 12 Jan? It should have been encouraging residents to apply for this vacancy since then. We now have a Communications Officer who should make this sort of thing a priority, not a photo competition - local democracy is more important.

The election will take place on 8 Feb 2024 for a Wetherby Town Councillor (West Ward) after Barbara Harpham resigned.

Completed nominations need to be <u>hand-delivered</u> to the Returning Officer at Leeds Civic Hall between 10 – 4 from Fri 5 to Fri 12 January 2024 (not Sat or Sun).

Proposals to Reduce Library/Hub Hours

Leeds City Council says that it, like many Local Authorities, is probably in its most challenging financial position since 2011, caused by;

- Reductions in funding from central government of over 30% of their budget in the last ten years.
- Increased costs due to the energy crisis.
- Rising cost of living, creating more demands on services.
- Increased demand for social care rising by £46m over the past 12 yrs

They say "In addition to our financial challenge this year, we already know we will need to save £58m next year, alongside £7m of already agreed savings; £60m the year after; and £46m the year after that. To date, we have had to find savings of £795m since 2010/11".

Their proposals are to reduce the Opening Hours of Community Hubs / Libaries, but they give no detail of what the cuts may actually be. They say the changes would not undermine their statutory duty. A consultation is taking place now. It's a questionnaire and should take about 10 minutes to complete.

Wetherby library is an invaluable community asset. Our Town Council have shown little interest in it. There is no regular agenda item on it and they have never discussed the cuts over recent years; opening hours and newspapers to a grand total of NONE now.

Meanwhile Otley has a modern, spacious library with better facilities and was open on Sundays, yes Sundays, not so long ago. We will compare and contrast with ours in a future issue.

Leeds are now in 4th place in the Championship, 6 points above fifth place and 7 points behind an automatic promotion place.


